Land Use Public Hearing

King County is sponsoring a meeting at the Fairwood Library on Monday, June 9th from 6-8 PM on land use at the Nike site. This will be the first open house meeting where the nearby citizens can talk about proposed changes in the area. There will be a brief presentation at 7 PM, but the purpose of the meeting is discuss the proposals and to get initial reactions from the citizens. King County received requests from the Rainier Christian Schools and the Kent School District to rezone the old Nike site from rural to urban for educational use.

Notices were mailed to property owners within 500 ft. of the boundaries of the Nike site property (now owned by the schools).
